Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Yashwant Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Post Graduate Training & Research Centre, At & P.O, Kodoli, Tal. Panhala, Dist. Kolhapur-416114, Maharashtra (AYU0157) inspection was conducted on 15.04.2025 and 16.04.2025 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 90 Seats in 14 Course namely in the subject (i) Ayurveda Samhita, Sanskrit and Siddhant 06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir 06 seats (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana 06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyan 06 seats (v) Rog Nidan-Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan -06 seats (vi) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidakya 06 seats (vii) Swasthavritta 06 seats (viii) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga 06 seats (ix) Kaumarbhritya Bala Roga -06 seats (x) Kayachikitsa 06 seats (xi) Shalya Tantra 12 Seats (xii) Shalakya 06 seats[Netra Roga-04seats And Karna,Mukha &Nasa roga-02seats] (xiii) Panchkarma 06 seats (xiv) Rachna Sharir 06 Seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2. The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder.
- 3. As per the Regulation no. 04 of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024 published on 01st October, 2024 there shall be 18 Postgraduate programs in Ayurveda on and from the date of publication of the said Regulations shalakya Tantra Postgraduate program has been divided into Shalakya- Netra Roga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Ophthalmology) & Shalakya- Karna, Naasa and Mukha Raga Chikitsa (Ayurveda Oto-Rhino Laryngology and same was informed to you vide letter Ref. No.-3/2025/MARB/General Matters dated 05.05.2025. In response of the same you have sent an email dated 14.05.2025 enclosing the letter vide ref no. YACK/PG/631/2025 dated 14.05.2025 in which for 06 seats of Shalakya Tantra you have opted for Shalakya-Netra Roga Chikitsa-04 seats and Shalakya- Karna, Mukha & Nasa Roga-02 seats.
- 4. The assessment report was duly placed in the 123rd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 23.05.2025 and Board concluded that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of extended permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations. Hence, the Board decided to issue Extended permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, and 90 Seats in 14 PG Courses in the subject namely (i) Ayurveda Samhita, Sanskrit and Siddhant 06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir 06 seats (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana 06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyan 06 seats (v) Rog Nidan-Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan –06 seats (vi) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidakya 06 seats (vii) Swasthavritta 06 seats (viii) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga 06 seats (ix) Kaumarbhritya Bala Roga –06 seats (x) Kayachikitsa 06 seats (xi) Shalya Tantra 12 Seats (xii) Shalakya 06 seats[Netra Roga-04seats And Karna,Mukha &Nasa roga-02seats] (xiii) Panchkarma 06 seats (xiv) Rachna Sharir 06 Seats in accordance with Regulations 15 (6) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for

Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024, as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

- 5. Therefore, Yashwant Ayurved Mahavidyalaya, Post Graduate Training & Research Centre, At & P.O, Kodoli, Tal. Panhala, Dist. Kolhapur-416114, Maharashtra (AYU0157) is hereby granted with Extended permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, and 90 Seats in 14 PG Courses in the subject namely - (i) Ayurveda Samhita, Sanskrit and Siddhant - 06 seats (ii) Kriya Sharir - 06 seats (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana - 06 seats (iv) Dravyaguna Vigyan - 06 seats (v) Rog Nidan-Rog Nidan avum Vikriti Vigyan -06 seats (vi) Agad Tantra avum Vidhi Vaidakya - 06 seats (vii) Swasthavritta - 06 seats (viii) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga - 06 seats (ix) Kaumarbhritya - Bala Roga -06 seats (x) Kayachikitsa - 06 seats (xi) Shalya Tantra - 12 Seats (xii) Shalakya - 06 seats[Netra Roga-04seats And Karna, Mukha & Nasa roga-02seats] (xiii) Panchkarma - 06 seats (xiv) Rachna Sharir - 06 Seats in accordance with Regulation 15 (6) of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda Regulations 2024, as per the provision under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26 subject to the conditions below mentioned condition shall be fulfilled:-
- Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats and 90 Seats in 14 PG Courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatary Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 1) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 3) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the process of issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
 - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled,
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024,
 - All the requirements of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024,
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- 5) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
